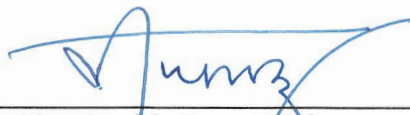

SUBJECT: Sheriff's Department Schedule A amendment for FY 2025-2026

RECOMMENDATION: The Finance/Personnel Subcommittee recommends that the City Council authorize the Mayor to execute the amended Schedule A contract (FY 2025-2026) for Law Enforcement Services with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department.

FISCAL IMPACT: The fiscal impact of the amended Schedule A for FY 2025-2026 is \$13,866,585 of which \$310,625 will be reimbursed by EVWD. There are sufficient funds in the FY 2025-2026 budget.

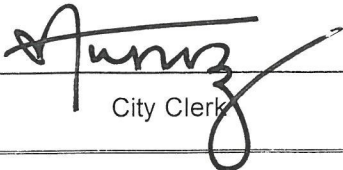
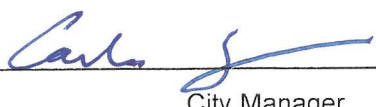
PUBLIC NOTICE: The agenda for this item was posted at the three required locations per Resolution No. 2011-047 and on the City's website.

BACKGROUND: The proposed FY 2025-2026 Schedule A reflects an overall increase of \$826,323 (\$13,866,585 - \$13,040,261) from the 2024-2025 amended Schedule A. There are proposed increases to service levels in this proposed Schedule A with the addition of one Office Specialist position and 3 deputy positions. The deputies are currently in negotiations with the County. As a result, this current proposed schedule A does not include any additional increases for salaries as a result of those negotiations-because they are not known at this time.

The reasons for the \$826,323 increase (by line item) are included in Attachment 2.
